
PARTRICK WETLANDS SAVED!

As you may have heard, ARS Partners, the Town of Westport, and the PWPF have worked out a settlement that saves the Partrick Wetlands. This agreement puts 22 acres of wetlands, bird sanctuary and woodland habitat into the hands of the communi-



ty to be preserved in perpetuity. No homes will be built in the Partrick Wetlands Preserve. Only 13 houses will be built – a 58% decrease from the 31 houses originally

planned. All of the homes will be north of Poplar Plains Brook on the former mining area off Newtown Turnpike. None will be closer than 350 feet from any existing house.

Phase I of the PWPF efforts is now complete: the Partrick Wetlands will now exist forever thanks to your efforts in writing letters, attending hearings and meetings, and making generous donations.
